Principal's News

What a truly wonderful term it has been. As I look back over the past 11 weeks I am incredibly proud of our school, its staff and students and our place in the community.

The House competition extending beyond Sports Day certainly adds to the sense of connection and pride within our school. It was wonderful that our young people were in community for the Clean Up Australia event and earning points for their houses.

An element of the Positive Behaviour for Learning House ticket system I like is that thought the winning house chooses the end of term reward, the whole school receives the reward, not just them. The reward acknowledges everyone's success and growth and we celebrate together. What a day Friday will be! I am especially looking forward to the Staff v Student cricket match with the slogan of "Let's hit cancer for 6" This fundraising venture Childhood Cancer has been organised by our Student Leadership Group and as I sit writing this I know their target of raising \$400 has already been exceeded to more than double this amount. Thank you to everyone who has so generously donated.

In 2019 Moonta Area School had an External School Review. These are usually a 3 year rotation Department for Education sites. Due to circumstances which impacted all areas of our society since then, delaying some processes, our latest review was held in late March. All teaching staff on site during this time, plus some Teaching Assistants and members of Governing Council plus large forums of students were interviewed as part of the process. Tours of the site were led by Assistant Principals Samantha Schultz, Wendy Williams and I. Learning Areas were visited and teaching learning programmes, plus policies and recording systems across all facets of our school were investigated over the three school visit days. Prior to this there had meetings sharing and been improvement work we have been undertaking since the 2019 review. We are waiting on the final report recommendations for our continued improvement. It was reaffirming however, on the final day, when the leadership exec met with the three review officers to hear praise for our students and how they presented themselves and spoke and for the wide number of programmes we have in plus student opportunities place. Moonta Area School. One of the review officers commented that the school 'has strong pillars for continued success with a committed staff, high levels of trust and confidence, plus happy students who are engaged in their learning and a supportive parent body'

The term break ahead will see major changes within our beautiful building. Demolition of our front office commences on Monday and recarpeting of a major section of the library is part of overall transformation. windows of the main building will be replaced and with new paint what a facelift this will be! This work is due for completion by June 30th. I know there will be some disruptions to access during this time but it will be worth it and I ask in advance for your understanding. We will keep our community advised as we receive direction from the builders. On Friday of this week boulders are being delivered ready for work throughout the establishing break on outdoor an learning area off of the middle school, including a large lawn area.

We wish teacher Cerys Kirkwood and her family all the best as they set off on a wonderful adventure travelling Australia for the rest of the school year. I am sure Cerys will keep in touch and we look forward to hearing about the places she visits and the experiences she has.

Term 2 commences on Tuesday April 30th for our students. Staff will be undertaking professional development on Monday April 29th in the areas of

Aboriginal Education, Positive Behaviour for Learning and Individual Learning Plans.







Tobacco and E-Cigarette Products Act 1997

From **1 March 2024**, new laws will ban smoking and vaping in a variety of public outdoor areas in South Australia. Regulations under the South Australian Tobacco and E-Cigarette Products Act 1997 are being introduced to address risks associated with passive tobacco smoking and passive inhalation of e-cigarette aerosol.

This will occur through the creation of smoke-free and vape-free areas. The ban includes early childhood services premises, and education and children's services facilities (including schools), and within ten (10) metres of their boundaries.

10-metre zone beyond the boundary

The new laws require the establishment of a 10-metre smoke-free and vape-free area in all public areas from the boundary of early childhood services and education and children's services facilities. This area does not extend into areas that are not open to, or used by the public, or a section of the public. For example, residential premises that share a boundary with, or are within 10 metres of the boundary of, children's education centres, child-care centres and school land.


