Autism Inclusion Teacher

My name is Kloe Timms and I am the Autism Inclusion Teacher (AIT) at Moonta Area School.

I have one day a week in my AIT role to focus on strengthening our school community's inclusion of students on the autism spectrum.

The Department for Education provides an Autism Inclusion Multidisciplinary (AIM) team to support me in the AIT role. The team includes senior advisor educators, developmental educator, psychologist, occupational therapist, speech pathologist and an Aboriginal cultural project officer. The information from the AIM team is evidence-based and informed by the autistic and autism community.

My role as an AIT is to pass on information, resources and training I receive from the AIM team to my colleagues and support them in the inclusion of all students.



Morphology is the smallest meaningful parts of words (morphemes), such as base words, prefixes and suffixes.








DID YOU KNOW?

What is the MAS PBL matrix?

Moonta Area School PBL Behaviour Matrix, is designed to encourage a positive and supportive environment for our children's learning and behaviour. The PBL Matrix is a tool to help establish common expectations and teach students the social, emotional and behavioural skills they need to thrive and achieve at school. These behaviour's encompass respect, responsibility, safety and cooperation, and they serve as the foundation for conducive learning by students being ready, being engaged and being respectful.

Through the PBL Matrix, our goal is to cultivate a culture where students feel valued, respected, and empowered to make positive choices. By clearly defining expectations across the whole school, we provide students with a consistent framework for understanding behavioural standards.

Year 12 Developing Minds Excursion

In Week 3, the Year 12 cohort attended our annual Adelaide Adventure Day. We began the day with a session run by Kirrili Smout from the Developing Minds company. Kirrili is a clinical psychologist who works with many schools across South Australia to support senior students especially in tackling the challenges of school, life, being a teenager and all those road blocks that can stop us from achieving our goals and dreams. Her session focused on how to get the most from your final school year. This session was held at Adelaide University and will be followed up with 2 further sessions over the course of the year, with Kirrili and the students engaging again online early in terms 2 and 3. Developing Minds also offers on-going support for our students and access for parents and families to their website portal as part of the deal.

After this session, we headed to Rundle Mall for a quick lunch stop, before students undertook a team challenge at Adelaide Adventure Rooms, where they battled 'The Mad Scientist' in an effort to escape the Escape Room – somewhat successfully!

It was a great day, with students taking lots of notes and engaging in a positive and constructive manner. Talking over the following weeks has demonstrated how some of the tips and techniques spoken about by Kirrili are being used and implemented by our students. This is also being followed up within our Pastoral Care program.
